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Principal's Message

Settling in to a great start - Maximising student engagement

By now all students from Prep to Year 6 have settled in to their classes for Term 1 of 2021. What our teachers do exceptionally well, is to ensure that these classroom routines and expectations are established early. Every day in our classrooms our teachers are explicitly teaching the fundamental elements of the Australian Curriculum. Each term our teachers moderate our assessment pieces to ensure the most accurate results are allocated to tasks utilising our marking guides. This is supported by our Head of Department Curriculum and each of our sector Deputy Principals.

At Trinity Beach State School we are continually striving to ensure that the best education in the most supportive learning environment is established. Positive student perception of our school is vital. I want all our students to have fun and love being here. Giving students the opportunity to reflect on this is very important. Please take the time to regularly engage with your child about their learning and their time at school. I often hear parents/ carers asking their children, 'What did you learn today?' and for years I was asking the same question. The most common answer was 'nothing' or 'I don't know'. I can assure you, that this is not the case. To support a more extended response, try the following:

- What made you smile today?
- What was your favourite moment?
- Who did you play with at lunchtime?
- Did anything make you sad and what can you do to cheer up?
- What was something that was difficult and how did you overcome it?

This open-ended approach may just get a deeper reflection than... 'nothing' or 'I don't know'.

Free Prep Vision Screening

Visit by Registered Nurse for Free Prep Vision Screening

Good vision is important for a child's educational, physical and social development. Vision screening checks for common eye conditions that may impact your child's ability to see and therefore impact their learning and development.

A Registered Nurse will be visiting the school between Monday 24 to Friday 28 May, 2021 to conduct vision screening for children in their Prep year. If you wish to have your Prep child participate in this free vision screening program, please complete and sign the consent form that has been sent home with your child and return this to your child's class teacher as soon as possible. Parents do not need to be present for screening, however if you

If your child's vision is screened, you will be advised of the results in writing. If a vision concern is found, you will receive a phone call from the nurse to discuss referral to an eye health professional for further assessment. If a vision concern is identified and your child requires glasses, eligible health care card holders

may be assisted with free basic glasses through the Spectacle Supply Scheme.

Participation in vision screening is not compulsory. If you do not wish for your child to participate in screening, please complete the consent form and indicate that you wish to decline screening.

Communication with the office regarding absences, late arrivals or early departures:

Students arriving late need to sign in at the office and obtain a late slip to give to their teacher. All students should be in class by 8.55am for roll marking at 9am. Students arriving after 9am are considered late. 9am is prime learning time, so try and give your child every opportunity to maximise their learning time by arriving before this time.

Early departures and/or changes to travel/collection arrangements. If you require you child to leave school early or travel home via a different method than normal, please send a note to school for the teacher. Telephone messages received during the day are hard to pass on without disrupting not only your child's learning, but the learning of others too.

- · Be prepared in the morning and ensure these travel arrangement are made and shared with your child well in advance of the start of the school day.
- In the case of an unforeseen emergency, the school will of course do everything in its power to deliver a message to your child, however the school cannot guarantee telephone messages received after 2.30pm will be able to be passed onto students. Our office staff have many processes in place to locate students and classes within our school, but at times it can be difficult if given a short time frame.

For General Absences, the day your child is away, please phone the school Absence Line on 4057 1444 and leave a message on the absence line. This is the most efficient method.

School Office Hours:

Please be reminded our school office hours at 8.30am to 3.45pm. Office doors will only be unlocked from 8.30am and will be closed at 3.45pm. We thank you for your understanding and support in allowing our dedicated office staff to work on many other important tasks.

BPoint is an online payment system which provides schools with one efficient method of collecting payment from parents/customers. BPoint is the preferred payment method for the Department of Education due to the effectiveness that automated receipting brings to schools. BPoint allows payments to be made against an invoice number. TBSS is no longer able to accept over-the-phone credit card payments. However, credit card payments may be made through the BPoint IVR (Interactive Voice Response) telephone payments.

My student is unwell or requires first aid:

Any student who is sick or injured must first get a note from their class teacher then go to sick bay located in the Administration building. If the student needs to be sent home because of illness, the office will ring parents to advise them. In the event of your student requiring expert medical attention, an ambulance will be called and your child will be taken to the hospital. Parents/guardians will be contacted immediately.

Administering medication at school:

If you require staff to administer medication to your child at school, please contact the school office in the first instance to discuss your child's requirements.

Please note, school staff will only administer medication that:

- has been prescribed by a qualified health practitioner (e.g. doctor, dentist)
- is in its original container
- has an attached pharmacy label.

Office staff will ask you to complete and sign Section 1 of the Administration of medication at school record sheet.

N.B. If your child requires more than one medication, you will need to complete a form for each medication.

- Did you know you can just click the link on the invoice and pay online?

Avoid the busy queues at school and pay online anytime!





Pick up and drop off zones

We encourage all parents to make use of the designated Stop, Drop and Go at the front of the school (Wewak Street) to ensure traffic congestion is minimised and safety enhanced at the beginning and end of each day. The purpose is for parents/carers to pick up and drop off students in the morning and afternoon and move on straight away.



No Dogs on School grounds

A reminder to all families and community members that dogs are not permitted on school grounds unless they are assistance dogs (paperwork must be sighted at the school office) or a police-handled dog. All other dogs must not enter the fenced school boundary at pick-up or drop-off times and the oval must not be used as a dog park out of hours. 



Government - Cairns and Hinterland Hospital and Health Service Oral Health Services

School Dental Service: Information for Parents

This is to advise all parents, caregivers, students and families that FREE Oral Health care is available throughout the year at the School Dental Service, (located at Smithfield Community Health Centre, Danbulan Street, Smithfield).

We offer NO CHARGE, routine dental examinations as well as treatment provisions that may be necessary as well as emergency care, during school hours, 5 days a week (including most school holidays).

This is a free service, that is NOT means tested and all children and young people aged 2 – 17 years are eligible. If families are eligible for Medicare Child Dental Benefit Scheme funding, (CDBS) you will be asked if you wish to Bulk Bill your child's visit. (*Please note: You do not need to have CDBS to attend our service)

Children and young people will see both Dental/Oral Health Therapists' who are professionally trained and have many years' experience in treating young people in a caring, child friendly, relaxed and unrushed environment. Dentists and Specialist Orthodontist referrals are also available through this service.
